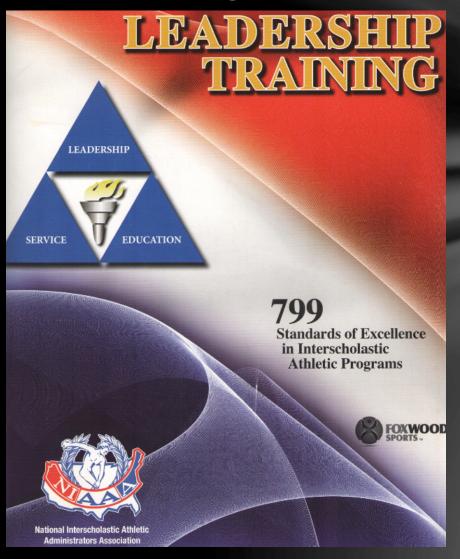


Qualifications:

*Athletic administrator of applicant school must be a member in good standing of the NIAAA and state athletic administrator association.

* Must have completed LTI Course 799







Application Process:

- *Complete the application demographic information.
- *Assemble required documentation.
- *Prepare electronic copies of the application and document package.
- *Send four jump drives with the information to the NIAAA by April 30th.



<u>Process</u>

- Do a quick overview to see Categories you might be deficient in example could be lack of LTI Courses or no mentoring program
- Begin with Category One
- Establish bi-weekly goals
- Ask for help-administrative assistant, coaches, trainers, etc.
- Utilize examples of documentation from other schools
- Be prepared to add areas where your program is deficient
